REFLECTION— St Vincent de Paul - 27th September

St. Vincent de Paul was a French Roman Catholic priest who dedicated himself to serving the poor. In 1605 he was captured, and sold as a slave. Two years later he and his master managed to escape and both returned to France. After becoming a chaplain in Rome, he spent his life preaching missions and providing relief to the poor. He even established hospitals for them. He later extended his concern and ministry to convicts. The need to help these people was so great and the demands beyond his own ability to, meant that he needed help. So he founded the Ladies of Charity (AIC), who were devoted to helping those in need.

There are many groups today, inspired by St Vincent de Paul's work, that aim to provide help to those who need it.

Prayer: Lord, spread the flame of love in your servants, so that through love of you, they give without restraint from what they have, to those who have nothing. Amen.

Reflection: "and do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased."

A polite reminder that we are unable to accept any of the old round pound coins from next week. Please note that the Finance office does not have the capacity to assist with changing coins for pupils. Thank you.

IS YOUR CHILD ELIGIBLE FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

In order for your child to receive free school meals and for the school to receive the Pupil Premium funding, a parent/carer must be claiming one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross Income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit.

If you believe that you are eligible and have not told us, please do contact the college. In addition to your child receiving the meal free of charge the college will receive additional funding and this is used to enhance provision for your child and could include 1-1 tutoring, music or co-curricular support.
