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FLYING START COMPETITION REGIONAL FINALS

Five teams from St. Bede's attended the Flying Start Competition Regional Finals on Tuesday 6th February. The Regional Finals took place at Aerospace Bristol, a new industrial heritage museum and learning centre at Filton. The museum tells the story of Bristol's world class aerospace industry – past, present and future and houses the famous Concorde aircraft.

Prior to the Regional Finals, the teams had to build a glider to a budget and create a poster about their design process and the physics of flight.

Each team presented their glider and poster to a judging panel of professional engineers, then the gliders took part in a 'fly-off' where teams scored more points if their glider went straight and far, finishing with a quiz about flight and engineering.

All the St. Bede's teams performed brilliantly with one team coming **2nd overall** out of **20 teams!** The team will now attend the **National Final 'Fly-off'** in March at the Fleet Air Arm Museum in Yeovilton.

A further team gained a place at the **National Finals** to participate in other engineering competitions during that day. Thank you to our Airbus mentor engineers and all the Flying Start sponsors for a great competition so far.

The fantastic exam results from summer 2017 have now been officially rewarded by the recent publication of the school performance tables.

For last year's Year 11 students, the college was ranked third in Bristol for attainment, with students achieving an average grade of 5.5, which would be an old B grade. St Bede's was ranked fifth for progress, with a Progress 8 score of 0.22. This means on average students achieved nearly a quarter of a grade above what would be expected – a fantastic achievement!

SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

Safer Internet Day 2018

This week at the college, pupils have been engaged in a number of activities to remind them of how to stay safe on-line. Here is a sample of one of the topics covered;

Managing your time online

According to Ofcom's annual Media Use and Attitudes Report, in 2017 young people between the ages of 11-15 spent on average 20 hours and 48 minutes online each week. This time could be spent doing anything from entertainment, to finding things out or communicating with others. However, we all have our own triggers to tell us when we have spent too long online. These might be physical things happening to our bodies like headaches or sore backs, changes to our moods or even noticeable changes to the device itself like reduced battery or overheating.

Top Tips

You could – set time limits, speak to someone, take regular breaks etc.

Your device could – be charged downstairs, avoid using devices at mealtimes, use night time modes and settings where available. Read more here:
