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## REFLECTION — 13th June

### St Anthony of Padua

At the age of 15, St Anthony asked to be sent to the Abbey of Santa Cruz where he learned theology and Latin. After seeing a small group of Franciscan friars, he felt a longing to join them and began to spread God's truth but became extremely sick.

After his recovery, he was asked to speak on whatever the Holy Spirit told him to speak of. Anthony had a book that contained notes to help teach students but was stolen by someone who left the hermitage. He prayed that it would be found or returned to him and it was returned soon after.

He was canonised less than a year after his death and made a Doctor of the Church in 1946 by Pope Pius XII. He is venerated as the Patron Saint for lost articles.



**Prayer:** Antony, give us your help in times of temptation; and enlighten our minds in searching the will of God. Help us to find the life of grace, which our sin destroyed, and lead us to the possession of the glory promised us by the Saviour. Amen.


