If any girls come to school in September in stretch fabric skirts they will be requested to replace these with a school skirt from our shop, before entering lessons.

All pupils should wear black shoes which can be polished or are patented. In the interests of safety, shoes must not have a heel.

Canvas, suede or trainer shoes are not permitted.

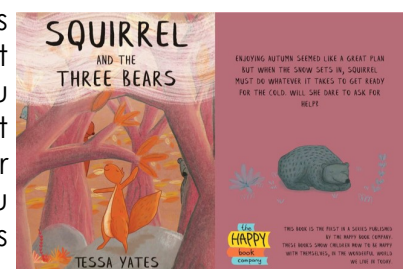

ENRICHMENT WEEK

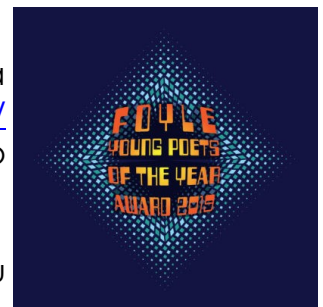
