Another exceptional year for students at St Bede's Catholic College

Students at all levels secured grades matching their greatest expectations and in many cases, exceeding target. Results of the most talented students were exceptionally strong with some stunning A*A performances including 54% pupils achieving A*A in **Additional Mathematics** and 52% either A* or A grade in **Spanish**.

Headline figures include:

- ♦ 81% achieved at least 5A*-C grades
- ♦ 80% of all grades at C+ including: Additional Mathematics 92%, Mathematics 77%, Food 93%, Music 90%, English 88%, ICT 88%, Physics 97%, Biology 92%, Chemistry 89%, Spanish 100%, Art 93%, Resistant Materials 86%, Religious Formation 83%, French 83%, PE 83%, History 81%
- ♦ 73% achieved C+ in both English and Mathematics

Distinctive A Star Performers - A^

Some outstanding results were achieved by the most talented with 27% of all grades at A*A.

Three students, **Eva Clothier**, **Arnold Gomes** and **Davis John** were successful in getting the new top grade of **A^** which is **A* Distinction**, in **Additional Mathematics**.

Three students achieved at least 10A* grades including Davis John 11A*, Harriet Selway 10A* and Isabella Redmond 10A*.

A further 16 students between them shared 174 A*A grades including:

In a climate of higher goal posts for C grades in a number of subjects, students of all abilities have achieved great grades, many having overcome significant health and emotional obstacles en route. Staff share the joy of these young people and look forward to working with significant numbers of them next year within 'Areté', our Sixth Form.

A Level Results in Areté 2016

Having established A Level provision only three years ago Areté at St Bede's has quickly positioned itself to be amongst the best in the city. Some 55 students completed their study with us and they are now celebrating the following successes.

2 A* - E 98% 3 A* - E 91% 1 A* - B 64% 2 A* - B 44%

We are pleased to report 95.2% of all grades at E or above and 72% at C+.

92% of those who studied the academically challenging EPQ achieved at least a B grade, with 62% achieving A*/A. The overall average grade for students was C+ with some stunning individual performances.

Stephanie Bell Young, Carys Greenaway, Abigail Mounter, Megan O'Brien and Alex Selway.

Carys is our very first student to be accepted at Oxford, where she will commence her study of Law in September. "I am absolutely elated to be going to Oxford," said Carys, aged 18, from Bradley Stoke. "I've wanted to be a barrister since I started secondary school and now I can achieve my dream."

Alex will study International Relations and History at The London School of Economics. **Abigail** has been accepted at University of Bristol to study Theology and Religious Studies. **Stephanie** goes to the University of Nottingham to study Veterinary Science and **Megan O'Brien** is taking a gap year before commencing university study. We wish all those leaving success in future study and happiness in life.

As we start our new year we are pleased to see Areté almost full to capacity.

St Bede's World Challenge Expedition to Swaziland

As many of you may know, 9 students from St Bede's Sixth Form travelled to Swaziland in July. We embarked on a 2 week expedition travelling around the country. 3 days of this involved trekking the Ngwempisi Gorge which provided some stunning scenery.





During our time in Africa we stayed among locals in a neighbourhood care point (NCP). Ndinda NCP cares for 35 orphaned and vulnerable children where they are given daily meals and education. The children are between 3-7 years old but lots of older children visit the NCP in the afternoons after they have finished school or work for that day. We were lucky enough to spend lots of time with these wonderful children, we taught each other games, played sports and on one of the days we attempted some glitter body art- the children have never seen things like this so were very excited!

All the children have either lost one or both parents or are considered 'vulnerable' as their parents are unable to care for them. This is because Swaziland has the highest HIV rates in the world. This was highlighted to us when 3 children who we had previously met, didn't turn up to the NCP one afternoon. We asked Thembi, the leader of the orphanage, where the children were and she told us that their mother had passed away that night due to AIDs. This was extremely upsetting to hear and made us make the most of our time in Swaziland, providing as much help as possible.





Part of the funds of the trip included paying for building materials/equipment and hiring a builder to provide the NCP with a water source. We worked closely with the builders and the locals to install a small dam and water tank about 300m away from the centre. It was up a very steep hill



as we had to access water from a small spring on the valley side...this made it very tiring!

We were taught by locals how to use pickaxes so we could dig a large trench from the source to the centre, water pipes were then fitted. A small block filtration system was also built close to the source, this meant we had to carry over 50 concrete bricks and many buckets of sand and crush up the

hill to build the foundations. This was incredibly challenging, especially because of the hot temperatures!

We all agreed that this was some of the hardest and physically challenging labour we had ever done but the local community were so thankful so of course it was all worthwhile! In fact, the builder in charge of the project, Billibi, told us that we did much more work than expected meaning they were ahead of schedule. He said we were the most hardworking challengers they have ever had and he begged us to stay! It is safe to say that we did ourselves proud.

We budgeted well on our trip meaning and were able to buy over 200 pieces of cutlery for the NCP. We also provided over 60 t-shirts, shorts, shoes, other clothing, cooking pots and pans etc. we decided to donate all of the medical supplies we brought on the expedition which included months' worth of pain relief, bandages, plasters, antiseptics, dioralyte and much more! Thembi and the locals really appreciated our donations and said that medical supplies are extremely valuable to them, something as simple as diarrhoea relief can save the life of a small child.

Finally, we would like to say a MASSIVE thank you to everyone at St. Bede's who donated and supported us. You made this dream a reality and all of us have taken so much from the trip, it was life changing.
