Our college was found to be among the best performing secondary schools in the country, receiving an award for being in the top 10% of non-selective schools nationally for attainment.

The SSAT Educational Outcomes database compares all state-funded schools in England, with the highest performing for a range of key measures presented with SSAT Educational Outcomes Awards, sponsored by Lexonik

Katie Gissing who gave presentations from topics as diverse as holidays, family and signs of the zodiac.


