SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

Please be advised that we have been notified of a suspected case of mumps but are awaiting confirmation of diagnosis. If confirmed, the pupil will remain absent from college until it is no longer contagious.

Mumps is most recognisable by the painful swellings at the side of the face under the ears (the parotid glands). Other symptoms of mumps include headaches, joint pain and a high temperature, which may develop a few days before the swelling of the parotid glands. The risk is particularly high for those children not protected by immunisation or by a previous infection with mumps. Therefore may we take the opportunity to offer a reminder to ensure that your child is up to date with their MMR immunisation.
