


REFLECTION REFLECTION—Saint Bede: The Patron Saint of Scholars

Congratulations to year 10 pupil **Mizi Hanyana** who received the Air Cadet Silver British Crest Award following completion of the Engineering and Logistics course.


Mizi, who has been a member of the Air Cadets in Weston for the last two years, will attend a Cadet dinner this weekend.

"On site, out of sight" Reminder

We recently updated the college policy on mobile phones, as we recognise the safeguarding benefits of young people having mobile phones for the journey to and from college.

The policy is "on site, out of sight", meaning students can bring mobile phones to college but they must be kept out of sight when in college – either in their bag or in their locker, switched off.

Bringing a mobile phone will be at the student's own risk and the college will **not** accept responsibility for damage or loss of any such item. A failure to keep mobile phones "out of sight" will result in them being confiscated.
