REFLECTION—29th June Feast of St Peter & Paul

Peter was one of Jesus' twelve apostles and is known as Simon Peter (Peter meaning 'rock'). He is important because the gospels describe Jesus as calling Peter his 'rock' upon which the future church would be built. He was the first to begin preaching to the gentiles. St Paul was previously known as Saul. Saul experienced a powerful vision that caused him to convert to Christianity while on the road to Damascus. He was baptised and took the name Paul. After establishing his churches, Paul remained in communication with the faithful, often writing letters to answer questions and resolve disputes - some of these are found in the Bible.

Congratulations to year 9 pupil **Seamus Robinson** who competed in the South West School 'Athletics Championships last week finishing second in 1500m.


Seamus will now take part in the **English Schools Championships**. Good luck!

SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

NHS Advice for adults and children on sunscreen and sun safety

- Remember that Sunburn can occur in the UK, even when it is cloudy. There is no safe or healthy way to get a tan. A tan doesn't protect your skin from the sun's harmful effects. Aim to strike a balance between protecting yourself from the sun and getting enough vitamin D from sunlight.
- Sunburn increases your risk of skin cancer.

Sun safety tips

Spend time in the shade when the sun is strongest. In the UK, this is between 11am and 3pm, March to October. Children should also remember this when they are at the college. There are many shady areas provided so please take shelter.

- make sure you never burn
- children need to take extra care

Wear Sun-Screen

• Don't rely on sunscreen alone to protect yourself from the sun - cover up with suitable clothing.

When buying sunscreen, the label should have:

- a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15 to protect against UVB
- at least four-star UVA protection
- Make sure the sunscreen is <u>not past its expiry date</u>. Most sunscreens have a shelf life of two to three years.
