## **REFLECTION 11th July - Feast of St Benedict**

Young Benedict was sent to Rome to finish his education but after watching the lives and ethics of his friends, he fled and gave up his inheritance, living in a small village. For many years, he lived as a hermit and was tempted by the Devil. After years of prayer, nearby monks came to ask for his leadership and he eventually set up twelve monasteries.

It was in Monte Cassino that he founded the monastery that became the roots of the Church's monastic system. Benedict did not found small separate communities but instead gathered his disciples into one whole community. Benedict's beliefs and instructions on religion were collected into what is known as the 'Rule of St Benedict' and continues to direct religious life today.

**Prayer:** "Almighty God, give me wisdom to perceive You, intelligence to understand You, diligence to seek You, patience to wait for You, eyes to behold You, a heart to meditate upon You and life to proclaim You, through the power of the Spirit of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen." - St Benedict
