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WELLNESS FORTNIGHT

We are nearing the end of a wonderful two weeks in which staff and pupils have focussed on improving their physical health and mental awareness in a variety of different ways.

We have welcomed inspirational guest speakers who shared their experiences with us and who have offered wise words and advice to our young people. In lessons, pupils have explored the brain, the science of stress and building resilience and looked at exam preparation, bereavement, the personal enrichment gained from travelling, healthy eating and the importance of sleep. All pupils and staff have had access to Headspace, an app which offers hints and tips to lead a happier, healthier life and all have participated in daily meditation.

We were delighted also to welcome 160 parents and carers to the first of two evening seminars based on understanding what is going on in the teenage brain. The second in the series will focus on Healthy Body, Healthy Mind at 6.30pm on 19th November.

A key aim of this fortnight was to remind everyone to take care of themselves emotionally as well as physically. Pupils and staff have fully embraced the whole experience and we hope we have helped provide strategies and techniques to those who may need support at various times throughout their lives.

Wellness levels will continue to be monitored throughout the year.

Important notice: A reminder for all parents and carers - Child feeling unwell?

Please discuss with your son or daughter the importance of following the correct procedure in the unusual event of feeling unwell in college.

Pupils who are not feeling well must seek permission from a member of college staff before leaving a lesson. It may be that having assessed the situation, a member of college staff will decide to send the pupil to reception.

Under no circumstances should a pupil attempt to use their own methods to speak directly to a parent or carer.

- College staff will medically assess the pupil and make a decision whether to call an emergency contact parent/carer or not.
- If a pupil needs to leave the college due to illness, they are not permitted to do so alone.
- Children must be collected by a named person, verified by details on the college administration system.


Continuing from our Wellness Fortnight we are pleased to present the second in the series of evening events. A seminar for parents/ carers and young people on...
