#### REFLECTION — 30th November - Feast of Saint Andrew

Andrew was Simon Peter's younger brother and both were called to be disciples and 'fishers of men.' However, in John's Gospel it states that Andrew was actually a disciple of John the Baptist and then made the decision to follow

Jesus afterwards. He was believed to be one of Jesus' closest disciples, as it was Andrew who told Jesus about the boy with the loaves and fishes and was present at the Last Supper.

After preaching the Good News, Andrew was crucified on an x-shaped cross, known today as \$t Andrew's cross, as he deemed



Our year 9's have had more fixtures than ever having taken part in a new Bristol Schools Rugby State School **Cup** competition. The cup was split in to two pools of four. The top two teams going through to a finals competition at Lockleaze and the bottom two from each group going in to a 'plate' competition at the same ground. Unfortunately, we didn't quite do enough to make the



cup competition but went in to the plate full of enthusiasm and ambition. The level of the teams was pitched perfectly after the group stages and none of the games were decided by more than a score. After beating Bristol Cathedral School in the semi-final, St Bede's came a **very close second** to a talented **Castle School** side. The inaugural incarnation of this competition was a great success and will hopefully see a much needed resurgence in school's rugby in the area.

Our Year 10's have had some more positive results and have managed to qualify for the next round of the **NatWest Bowl** after **beating Oasis Academy Brightstowe**. They will now travel away to face either **Reading School** or **Dauntsey's School** from Devizes.

In an exciting first for the College, we were able to field an Areté side for a fixture against St Brendan's College. Having had a few of our extremely successful Year 11 side from the 17/18 academic year go through in to our sixth form, we were able to field a very competitive team and won the fixture 38-14. We hope for this to be the start of many fixtures for Areté as we see more of our students stay on for the next level of their education with us.

In October, twenty pupils from St. Bede's were fortunate enough to travel to Nepal for 16 days with the Scouts Cabot District. The group visited world heritage sites in BoudhaNath, SwayambhuNath and PashpartiNath, before travelling to Meghauli where they ran a Jungle Jamboree camp for local scout groups. They also visited health improvement projects and took part in an elephant safari.

Areté student Eloise Mills gives us an insight into the trip:

A few weeks ago I went to Nepal. It was amazing and a trip of a lifetime.

Imagine riding an elephant in the middle of a jungle, finding wild hippos, or being climbed on by wild monkeys at a monkey temple. Now for some, this may not sound like 'the trip of a lifetime' but it really was. We hiked over the himalayas, went down water rapids and danced till our feet dropped and even saw a dancing cow!

The trip allowed me to make so many new friends, some Nepalese and some who also travelled with the scouts. People that I would never have usually spoken to, either because of social groups or age differences, have now become some of my closest friends.

Being able to escape reality and live a completely different life, and being able to experience a completely different culture was incredible.

Nepal was an experience that really has changed my life. The way that I now see materialistic goods has completely changed from how I did a few months ago. I have learnt so much from those weeks away, from how much we over-value useless items and how much I am wasting my time watching television.

Now I'm not saying you should go ahead and join scouts but I am saying do something which means something. Join new clubs, experience new things and step out of your comfort zone, because in reality, life is extremely short and we can't afford to waste it.


# **FLYING START**

Last week 29 Year 8 students enjoyed a day off timetable to work with Airbus engineers on the 'Flying Start Challenge'. The day gave the girls and boys a chance to gain some insight into the aviation industry by building a glider. The Challenge aims enthuse and inspire young people to consider a career in the engineering industry; whilst teaching them about basic engineering concepts. Success is down to the pupils' design and build skills, and down to the engineering knowledge they have acquired during the Challenge.

Over the course of the day the students worked in teams to design and build a glider. The activity helped them to develop their communication and teamwork skills in an educational (and fun!) setting. It was a vital requirement that the glider they produced could carry a weight of 40g. Beyond this, points were awarded for distance and accuracy - the highest scoring gliders were those which could fly the furthest in a straight line. The pupils were taught about the theory of lift, and about how symmetry, and balance of weight and lift, lends to a successful glider. They also had to consider their materials budget, a financial skill which is vital for future careers.

Two teams of 4 students were successful in getting through to the **regional final**, in which pupils have to complete a poster presentation and a quiz to illustrate their knowledge of gliders. This will be held at Aerospace Bristol and students will get the opportunity to tour the museum and view the last Concorde to fly.


