Congratulations to Year 12 student **Daniel McTiernan** who has been elected as a **Youth Member of Parliament**. The announcement was made at City Hall on Friday 8th February following the counting process.

Daniel campaigned against 17 other candidates from across Bristol, with young people aged between 11-18 voting in the election. Daniel focussed his campaign on the impact of academic and social pressures on mental health.

He said: I am keen to be the voice of students at St. Bede's and students in Bristol. I wish to thank all those who voted for me to represent them over the last few weeks and promise I will do everything in my power to try and promote change.

We look forward to hearing of the good work you will do on behalf of the young people in our City.

REFLECTION—14th February Memorial of St Cyril and St Methodius

St Cyril and his brother, St Methodius, travelled to Moravia (part of modern day Czech Republic) to preach the Gospel, translating the liturgy into a Slavonic alphabet. They later came to Rome, where they were met by the Papal Court and reported their labours to which there was some opposition. Soon after, Cyril died and was buried in St Peter's, although he was later transferred to San Clemente. Methodius returned to Moravia, continuing to labour as a missionary.

Reflection: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..."



Prayer: Lord, we pray that we may be inspired by Saints Cyril and Methodius who preached to many who refused to listen, and continue to spread God's word. May we be witnesses to Your goodness and bring others to know you. Amen.

ARETÉ STUDENTS TRIP TO LONDON

On Thursday 7th February, 30 Sixth Form students visited the Houses of Parliament. When we arrived students had a brief tour of the Supreme Court of Justice. Then students were taken on a guided tour around the Palace of Westminster including watching a live debate in the House of Commons and House of Lords. You may have seen the Commons on TV as this is where the Prime Minister takes part in Question Time each week. They also visited Westminster Hall (which is 1000 years old and also where Guy Fawkes was put on trial). Students then took part in a workshop on how laws are made and had to follow the protocols that MPs and Peers use when in debates in each house.

In the afternoon students went on a guided tour around London learning about the life of Karl Marx. This is particularly useful for students studying sociology, law, religious

studies or politics. Students commented that the trip helped them to consider careers in politics, the civil service and law as well as possibly studying university in London. FLYING START COMPETITION REGIONAL FINALS

Two teams from St. Bede's attended the **Flying Start Competition Regional Finals** on Monday 11th February. The Regional Finals took place at Aerospace Bristol, a new industrial heritage museum and learning centre at Filton.

Prior to the Regional Finals, the teams had to build a glider to a budget and create a poster about their design process and the physics of flight.

Each team presented their glider and poster to a judging panel of professional

engineers. Then the gliders took part in a 'fly -off' where teams scored more points if their glider went straight and far, finishing with a quiz about flight and engineering. Both St. Bede's teams performed brilliantly. We are awaiting to hear if our teams have gained a place at the National Finals which is held in March at the Fleet Air Arm Museum in Yeovilton.

ROYAL SOCIETY OF CHEMISTRY'S 'TOP OF THE BENCH' COMPETITION

The national competition involved a whole day of challenging tasks at the University of

Bristol's School of Chemistry. Our students were put through their paces having to undertake a test of their factual chemical knowledge, as well as two practical chemical problems requiring expert investigative skill and teamwork.

After lunch they attended a 'flash-bang' lecture exploring atmospheric chemistry. The students enjoyed the day and narrowly missed out on a top 3 place. Well done!

Last weekend, as part of the A Level Art course, 12 of our Art Students were given the opportunity to visit the 'home' of Art - St. Ives in Cornwall where they visited the Barbara Hepworth Museum and Tate St. Ives. "ON SITE, OUT OF SIGHT"

We are updating the college policy on mobile phones, as we recognise the safeguarding benefits of young people having mobile phones for the journey to and from college.

The new policy is "on site, out of sight", meaning students can bring mobile phones to college but they must be kept out of sight when in college – either in their bag or in their locker, switched off.

Bringing a mobile phone will be at the student's own risk and the college will not accept responsibility for damage or loss of any such item. A failure to keep mobile phones "out of sight" will result in them being confiscated.

Collection of confiscated items by parents from the college reception can be arranged by appointment.

STAFF VACANCIES

Governors at St. Bede's Catholic College wish to appoint the following:

- School Meals Supervisory Assistant (SMSA) The post is 7.5 hours per week and £8.00 per hour (this will increase to £9.00 in April 2019)
- Cleaner This will be a permanent contract of 16 hours per week for which the hours of work are 3.00pm to 6.15pm Monday to Thursday and 3.00pm 6.00pm on Friday. The hourly rate is £8.00 (increasing to £9.00 per hour in April 2019)
- **Invigilators** to provide support to the examination process within the College.

Employment is offered on a casual, sessional basis and the hours of work would be between 8.30 am to 4.30 pm. The main external examinations take place in May/June each year but internal examinations can take place throughout the year.

The hourly rate of pay is £9.00 which includes payment for a proportion of accrued holiday entitlement.

SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

Almost half (45%) of young people are checking their mobile phones after they have gone to bed, a Digital Awareness UK poll suggests.

A survey of 2,750 11 to 18 year-olds found one in 10 admitted checking their mobile phones for notifications at least 10 times a night.

How to Cut down on screen-time

- **Refrain** from using screens 90 minutes before bedtime
- **Turn off notifications**, or activate "do not disturb", "aeroplane mode" or mute settings.
- **Turn the phone off** altogether if you can
- **Reduce blue light exposure**, which can disrupt sleep. For example, many devices have the "night shift mode", which changes the colour temperature of your device to reduce exposure
- Try and break the habit of constant, unprompted device checking
- Consider using a screen time tracker apps, such as RealizD and Moment, that can showcase the amount of time you are spending on your device. Some of these apps allow you to set usage restrictions
- **Digital detox** take a break from devices altogether or set times that you will turn your phone off. Keep your phone in a location that prevents you from seeing, hearing or even reaching for it (in a drawer or box)
- **Switch the habit** in the 90 minutes running up to bedtime, get stuck into a good book, perhaps try headspace, meditation, or a relaxing bath!
- **Think.** If we think about the reasons why we are using mobile devices at night time, we would often think twice

We will send you an activation email within the next few weeks. Simply click on the link from your tablet, PC or smartphone to activate your account. If you are a year 9 parent/carer you will need to use the same login that you were sent for Options Online.

After clicking the link you will then be able to login using your Facebook, Twitter, Google or Microsoft username and password.

You will be asked the date of birth for one of your children at the school.

Next you just need to download the app

From your smartphone or tablet, download the app from the Google Play or Apple App store - search for SIMS Parent.
