At the age of 11, Frances knew that God wanted her to become a nun. However, this was not what her father wanted, who forced her to marry a good and noble man. Frances found that her new life was much harder and collapsed from the strain, laying close to death for a few months.

Frances had a vision of St Alexis, a young man who had ran away to beg instead of marrying as his family wished. He spoke to Frances saying "You will live to glorify His name" and her recovery was immediate. After a flood brought disease and famine to Rome, Frances gave orders that no one asking for alms should be turned away, and she went out to the poor with corn, oil and clothing. After her husbands death, Frances became the superior of the lay order of women she had founded, achieving her dream of becoming a nun.

It is fantastic to see the link between St Bede's and the boys still so strong and the monies raised by the various House initiatives and other fundraising going directly to such a good cause.

#### Home-Start Bristol is recruiting local volunteers to support families who are struggling.

Home-Start Bristol is a charity that supports families that are struggling to cope. Its success depends on constantly recruiting and training new volunteers and the next training course will take place at Windmill Hill City Farm starting in April.

Volunteers are parents or grandparents themselves, who can understand the challenges families may be facing. They are trained, and matched with a family in their area and visit the family once a week for 2-3 hours to offer friendship, a listening ear and practical support.

The next preparation course starts on Thursday 25th April at Windmill Hill City Farm and will run every Thursday 10am-2pm for 9 weeks (with a break for half term).

The course is accredited which means volunteers can opt to do some additional coursework to gain a level 2 qualification.
