## Phenomenal success for our 'resolute, courageous and meticulous' GCSE and A Level students

Congratulations to our GCSE and A Level students who celebrated excellent achievements this year.
GCSE Results-Students at all levels secured grades matching their highest expectations and in many cases, exceeding their targets. GCSE Results of the most talented students were exceptionally strong with some outstanding performances at Grades 9-7 including:
$88 \%$ of students achieving Grade 7+ in Spanish, $70 \%$ achieving $7+$ in French, $69 \%$ achieving $7+$ in Music and $50 \%$ of students achieving Grade $7+$ in Religious Studies.

$80 \%$ achieved Grade 4+ in both English and Mathematics $\quad 9 \%$ of all grades were Grade 9
$22 \%$ of all grades were Grade 8+
$55 \%$ of all grades were Grade 6+
$36 \%$ of all grades were Grade 7+

$86 \%$ of all grades were Grade 4+
Best average grade in College this year is awarded to Giulia Ferrazzano who achieved eight Grade 9s, two Grade 8s and a Distinction* in BTEC, Niamh Fullerton also achieved nine Grade 9s, Jeffymol Joseph achieved eight Grade 9s, Joss Carr achieved seven Grade 9s and Molly Dolan and Rohit John both achieved six Grade 9s.

20 students achieved ten Grades 9-7 including Gemma Blessing, Joss Carr, Philippa Crane, Catriona Davies, Maegan De Rama, Niamh Fullerton, Elita Fernandes, Giulia Ferrazzano, Liyana George, Rohit John, Jeffymol Joseph, Florence Magner, Holly Naylor, Ana Parish, Amy Price, Annie Rogers, Ella Staddon, Jasmine Varghese and Matthew Wood.
A further 91 students between them shared 416 grades at 7+.
A Level Results-'A' Level provision in Areté is well established and St Bede's continues to be amongst the best in the city with $32 \%$ of the cohort taking A/AS Level examinations achieving at least 1 A* or A grade.

The deadline to apply is 30 June 2021. If the UK leaves the EU without a deal: You will need to be living in the UK before it leaves the EU to apply. ## AMAZING ADDO!

Ms Sharp, Head of Pasteur House and English teacher at St Bede's, spent four weeks of her summer in South Africa. Ms Sharp has very kindly shared with us her experience:
'In July and August of this year, I was fortunate enough to visit and support excolleague and former Teacher at S $\dagger$ Bedes, Sister Martha O'Connor in the South African township of Addo in the Eastern Cape. Sisters' Martha and Breda have worked there tirelessly for fourteen years. If
 it's not ferrying people to the clinic, the hospital or Home Affairs, it's organising food and clothing provision, supporting and running the Crèche and Pre-School (that they were instrumental is setting up), organising and running retreats, supporting the local schools, running Computer programmes for students and teachers, researching and ensuring that births, deaths and more have been registered to enable people to have that basic right; their own identity/ identification, then they are 'just' being a huge, significant and valuable part of the local communities. They are truly loved and respected.... and I was lucky enough to be able to work by their side, as well as teaching English at St Colmcille's School where I prepared the Matrix students for their Mock exams. What an incredible experience it was.

One of the lovely things about Sister Martha and Sister Breda, apart from their determination and dedication, is their sense of humour. There were many sad and heartbreaking situations and circumstances encountered, but both did all that they could to ensure that I had a fully rounded experience during my stay in South Africa from Zip Wires over the Bush to the beautiful citrus farms to watching the elephant families and other wildlife in the National Elephant farm.

I have brought home precious memories and experiences; the characters, the faces, the children, that I will never ever forget. I hope I can share some of my experiences and through Sisters Martha and Breda, help to inspire the young people at St Bede's to support the wonderful work that goes on in Addo.
