REFLECTION – 27 September Memorial of St Vincent de Paul


The French priest St. Vincent de Paul (1581-1660) organised works of charity, founded hospitals, and started two Roman Catholic religious' orders.

Vincent was a man of action rather than of theory. The religious spirit he communicated was simple, practical and straightforward. He looked to Christ as his leader and tried to translate the Gospel message into concrete results. He died on 27th September 1660, and was canonized a saint in the Roman Catholic Church in 1737. The religious groups he founded continue to carry on his work to this day.

EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION LECTURE

Year 13 who are currently involved in the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) enjoyed an extremely engaging and useful lecture from Dr Becki Nash from the University of Southampton earlier this week.

The EPQ is a qualification with UCAS points equivalent to half an A Level. Students must work independently on their own project to produce either a 5,000 word essay or an artefact with an accompanying research report. As well as the benefit of additional UCAS points, the qualification teaches invaluable research, report writing, presentation and project management skills which makes their transition to university much smoother.

With extensive experience in researching her own doctorate, and many years of involvement in the EPQ, Dr Nash was able to give the students lots of guidance and practical tips to help them carry out their own research projects to a high standard. All students agreed it was an informative and enjoyable lecture.
