Please re-enforce road safety with your children, particularly at the peak times of arrival in the morning and at the end of the day when traffic is particularly busy on the Long Cross.



# **REFLECTION – 14 May – St Matthias**

This week we celebrate the feast of St Matthias

Saint Matthias is the disciple who, in the Acts of the Apostles, was chosen to replace Judas Iscariot after Judas betrayed Jesus.

Acts tells us that Matthias accompanied Jesus and the Apostles from the time of the Lord's Baptism to his Ascension and that, when it became time to replace Judas, the Apostles cast lots and Matthias was chosen.



What was the holiness of Matthias? Obviously, he was suited for apostleship by the experience of being with Jesus from his baptism to his ascension. He must also have been suited personally, or he would not have been nominated for so great a responsibility. We also know that the holiness of Matthias was his readily receiving the relationship with the Father offered him by Jesus and completed by the Holy Spirit. If the apostles are the foundations of our faith by their witness, they must also be reminders, if only implicitly, that holiness is entirely a matter of God's giving, and it is offered to all, in the everyday circumstances of life.

**Reflection:** "they were capable of becoming apostles on being chosen by Him who foresees even ultimate issues. Matthias, accordingly, who was not chosen along with them, on showing himself worthy of becoming an apostle, is substituted for Judas."

Prayer: Prayer for the intercession of St Matthias Father, you called Saint Matthias to share in the mission of the apostles. By the help of his prayers may we receive with joy the love you share with us and be counted among those you have chosen. Pray that we may become worthy witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus in the way we live the eternal life we have right now. Amen.

## FINANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

#### Direct Debit Payments for Year 11 and Year 13 leavers

This is a polite reminder that parents/carers of students in Year 11 and 13 are contracted to continue paying the transport payments until the 31 August 2021. The cost of transport is calculated based on the payments being spread over 12 months in order to make it affordable. Therefore any direct debits cancelled before the end of the contract/ agreement of 31 August will be invoiced directly. If payments are discontinued this could affect our ability to provide this service in the future.

# SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

#### Staying safe on foot and bike

Look out for yourself and your friends when on foot or bicycle.



Choose the safest routes you can (which are often nicer anyway), like

quieter, slower roads, with pavements if you're walking or cycle paths if you're going by bike.

It's easy to get distracted by your phone or by friends, but you need to be alert to traffic. Put your phone away and take your earphones out when crossing the road. Don't trust that drivers will spot you. Anything you can do to protect yourself is a good thing.

## Young people accepting lifts from others

#### Advice for Parents and Carers

✓ Talk to your son or daughter about the dangers of accepting lifts from others driving cars or motorbikes. Young drivers, young males in particular, are the highest risk group of drivers due to their age and inexperience: this means they are particularly likely to take risks and less able to cope with hazards.

 $\checkmark$  It's safest to avoid lifts altogether with young drivers, or at least don't get a lift with someone you don't trust completely to drive under speed limits, completely sober, and focused on the road.

✓ Agree with your son or daughter that you will always pick them up if they are stuck and need you to, even if it's late at night. Make sure they're always able to get

hold of you if they need to, and tell them they can call you any time, day or night. It might be an inconvenience, but better safe than sorry. If you don't drive, give your son or daughter emergency numbers and tell them you have cash in the house to pay for it in case they get stranded without a lift and need to get home.
