# MESSAGE FROM MR MAHER, PRINCIPAL

As we continue to come out of lockdown it is timely to re-enforce routines and the high standards we expect of all our students here are St Bede's Catholic College.

Year 11 and 13 students celebrated their last day at St. Bede's today and we wish them all well. Those returning for the sixth form will have work to complete at home prior to the Areté induction days on the 23rd and 24th June.

When students in years 7 – 10 return on Monday 7th June, all students are expected to be in correct uniform including the designated school skirt or trouser for the girls. No straight skirts will be allowed as we have received all orders from the uniform supplier and distributed the correct uniform to all who have requested it. Please contact Mrs Mason in the uniform shop should you need to purchase uniform or have not received your completed order to date.

Blazers should be worn at all times including travelling to and from college. Jewellery is limited to a wristwatch and a single stud earring in each ear. Nose piercings are not permitted in accordance with the uniform policy. Shoes should be low heeled, black leather style which can be polished. Trainers and basketball shoes are not acceptable. Mobile telephones should be switched off and carried in bags and should not be out for any reason during the college day – 'on site – out of sight'.

Year 8 students will move into the Humanities block and Year 9 will move onto the top floor of the A block. This will enable Science practical lessons to resume which students have been looking forward to all year.

Schools were asked to be flexible and more understanding regarding uniform during the periods of lockdown. However, as we work towards the 21st June our high expectations have returned and we are grateful to all parents for your support in this matter.


### **REFLECTION – St. Bede**

This week we have celebrated the feast of St. Bede

The Venerable Bede, or Saint Bede, was an English monk who lived in a monastery in Northumberland. He is best known for writing the Ecclesiastical History of the English.

He was born in 673 and taken to a monastery at 7 years old. Bede learned Latin, Greek and Hebrew and became

one of the most learned men in England, although he never left the country.



St. Bede, is widely regarded as the greatest of all the Anglo-Saxon scholars and is one of the few saints honoured as such even during his lifetime. His writings were filled with such faith and learning that even while he was still alive, a Church council ordered them to be read publicly in the churches.

The Venerable Bede died in 735. Even on the day of his death, he was busy dictating a translation of the Gospel of St. John. When finished, he lay upon the floor of his cell singing, "Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost" He was buried in Jarrow, although his remains were later moved to Durham Cathedral, where his tomb can be seen today.

The Church declared him to be 'venerable' in 836. He was made a saint in 1899, as well as a Doctor of the Church, the only English man to hold that title.

#### **Reflection:** He wrote of himself:

"I have devoted my energies to the study of the scriptures, observing monastic discipline, and singing the daily services in church; study, teaching, and writing have always been my delight."

# AN HOUR WELL SPENT WITH THE DEPUTY GOVERNOR OF THE BANK OF ENGLAND

On 13th May, Sam Woods, the Deputy Governor of the Bank of England, gave a personal account of his career, and advice for those about to embark on working life, in an engaging presentation to St. Bede's Sixth Form.

Giving his story from leaving university with a degree in English and History, and working in many sectors, from selling whiskey to business consultancy, Sam described how he has had to adapt to new working environments, even taking a tutor to improve his skills in calculus, required in a finance role. He explained how he managed the stresses and strains of his job, organising time and other commitments and how he enjoyed working in the public sector, finding great satisfaction in the sense of 'doing the right thing' that a job in the civil service can provide. Comparing public sector with private sector working, he summarised the main differences as he saw it, something that students found valuable in directing their own career choices.

Advising those setting out on any career, he emphasised the importance of achieving the best grades you can, and investing time and effort in putting together your CV; whilst the content has to be relevant, the appearance, layout and presentation must be attractive, and he encouraged including an aspect that reveals something of your character as important.

Sixth form students had an impressive array of questions for the Deputy Governor, leading to a lively session towards the end of the presentation, covering many topical issues such as inflation, interest rates, Brexit and economic recovery Post-Covid. The session was a valuable opportunity to learn from the experience of such a quality speaker, appreciated by students.

# **Test & Trace Support Payments**

#### £500 grants available for eligible workers

Have you been asked to self-isolate? Or has your child been sent home from school to self-isolate?

You can apply for a £500 grant if you have lost income due to self-isolating. You must be in employment or self-employment and unable to work from home.

You can now also apply for the grant if you are caring for a child who is self-isolating.

To be eligible for a Test and Trace Support Payment you must either:

- have been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or the COVID-19 app
- be looking after a child under 16 years of age who usually attends an educational or childcare setting but is self-isolating on or after 8 March 2021
- be looking after someone under 26 years of age with an Education, Health and Care

Plan (EHCP) who usually attends an educational setting but is self-isolating on or after 8 March 2021

You must also be receiving one of the following: Universal Credit, Working Tax Credit, income-based Employment and Support Allowance, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Income Support, Housing Benefit and/or Pension Credit.

If you don't receive one of the benefits, you may qualify for a discretionary payment. The Department of Health and Social Care have made extra funds available monthly to support our discretionary decisions allowing us to include more citizens.

You have 42 days from when your self-isolation began to apply, should you apply outside of that your claim can still be considered, but please include any reasons or circumstances that led to a late application
