REFLECTION – Nativity of John the Baptist

This week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist

John the Baptist spent his adult life preparing the way for Jesus, and proclaiming, "**the Kingdom of Heaven is close at hand**." He was born to Zachary and Elizabeth, an elderly married couple. The Angel Gabriel had visited Zachary and told him that his wife would bear a child, even though she was already past the childbearing age.

Elizabeth was Mary's cousin and Zachary was a priest of the Temple in Jerusalem. As a baby in the womb, John recognized Jesus' presence in Mary's womb when Mary visited Elizabeth soon after the Annunciation. Both women were expecting children at the same time.



John was probably born at Ain-Karim, which is southwest of Jerusalem. As a young adult, he lived as a hermit in the desert of Judea until about A.D. 27. When he was 30, he began to preach on the banks of the Jordan, calling for repentance and baptizing people in the river waters. When Jesus came to John to be baptized, John recognized Jesus as the Messiah and baptized Him, saying: "It is I who need baptism from you."

John continued to preach after Jesus was baptised, but was imprisoned not long after by Herod Antipas.

John was beheaded at the request of Salome, daughter of Herodias. Many came to know Jesus through John, namely the Apostles Andrew and John.

Reflection: When Jesus stepped into the waters of the Jordan and was baptised by John the Baptist, he did so not because he was in need of repentance, or conversion: he did it to be among people who need forgiveness, among us sinners, and to take upon himself the burden of our sins. *Pope Francis*

YOUNG CARERS

At St. Bede's we have always valued our Young Carers and the extra role they play in their families and homes. We belong to the YCiS -Young Carers in School programme. They define a Young Carer as:

"Anyone under the age of 18 who provides care for another family member, parent or sibling, be this practical or emotional that would normally be expected of an adult. Care can include anything from helping with household chores, cooking, medical assistance, organising and supporting siblings and emotional support. Most Young Carers do not identify as carers at first as they are caring for someone they love."

Sometimes a young person might find they take on such a role for a temporary time due to family circumstances or for a longer period.

At St Bede's we offer each Young Carer the opportunity for a discrete well being check in, each term or more regularly with the 121 team.

ACTIVITY TRIP

Year 7 and 8 enjoyed an activity trip to Shropshire last weekend. Blessed with beautiful weather, they all had a great time. **Edie** and **Brendan** share their experience.

The trip to Shropshire was most definitely one to remember! My favourite activity was the high ropes. We had to walk across platforms which moved when you stepped on them. We also canoed and kayaked across an ice cold lake and raced each



other. The weather was hot and humid and the air was warm even when the sun hid behind the clouds.

The trip had a wide range of activities from raft building to rifle shooting. The raft building and kayaking was on a small lake which was super cold on a hot day. We also participated in abseiling and high ropes.

INSTRUMENTAL AND VOCAL TUITION SEPTEMBER 2021

We are hoping to resume instrumental and vocal tuition from September. Pupils opting to learn an instrument or have voice lessons are taught by one of the college's visiting music teachers. Pupils have a 30-minute lesson each week for 33 weeks of the academic year. Lessons are held on the same day each week and the times follow a rotation to ensure your child does not miss the same curriculum subject each week.

For pupils learning in pairs, the cost of lessons is £282 per year, paid by a monthly direct debit of £23.50 per month. For 1-2-1 tuition, the cost is £540 per year, paid by a monthly direct debit of £45 per month. Pupils who are entitled to Pupil Premium funding are supported with the cost of lessons.

Letters will be sent to parents and carers over the next few weeks. If you would like your child to have music lessons at St. Bede's, please return the reply slip at the bottom of the letter to Mrs Mason in Reception, together with a completed direct debit form.
