MESSAGE FROM MR MAHER, PRINCIPAL

REFLECTION

3 July – St Thomas

This weekend we celebrate the feast day of St Thomas

The feast day of St. Thomas, the Apostle, is celebrated on July 3. Thomas was known for questioning things. He was not afraid to ask questions or state his disbelief.

St. Thomas was also known as "Doubting Thomas". After the resurrection, Jesus appeared to the Apostles. Thomas was not there and did not believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. When Jesus later appeared to him he said "Peace be with you. Do not doubt but believe." (John 21:24) St. Thomas also asked



Jesus "How can we follow you, when we know not where you are going?" Jesus responded, "I am the way, the truth and the life. Whoever follows me will live forever."

Thomas was one of the original twelve apostles. He was present at the Last Supper. After the resurrection, St. Thomas was sent to evangelize the Parthians, the Persians and India. He died as a martyr at Calamine in India, when he was speared to death while praying.

Reflection: After doubting that Jesus had indeed risen from the dead, Jesus appeared and showed his wounds to Thomas. After verifying the wounds were true, St. Thomas became convinced of the reality of the Resurrection and exclaimed, "My Lord and My God," thus making a public Profession of Faith in the Divinity of Jesus.

O St. Thomas, you spread the light of Christ in the hearts of the people. You humbly confessed "My Lord and My God" and sacrificed your life for love of him. YEAR 8 CYBER CHALLENGE

On Wednesday 23 June, sixteen Year 8 students from St Bede's competed against dozens of other schools across the UK in the Cyber Unlock challenge cohosted by UWE and cybersecurity experts, Immersive Labs.

Typically, Bristol-based Immersive Labs are used to working with a wide range of large organisations from public services such as the NHS and the Metropolitan Police to private organisations such as AirBnB, Procter and Gamble and a host of well known financial organisations.

For the Cyber Unlock challenge, Immersive Labs provided all participating students with access to their online "labs" which allow users to improve their cyber expertise through a mixture of theory and

practical activities including virtual environments that simulate real-life cyber attacks.



Armed with some last minute training in analysing metadata, registry keys, malware and social media archives, our St Bede's students were informed to "just have fun ... but win at all costs". Although most of our local competitors were schools in the private sector, St Bede's' students held their own and Mr Bogle warned the organisers that Bristol Grammar School's staff representative was wearing a loud tie that was clearly causing issues with our network capabilities.

Ironically, just over an hour and a half into the two hour competition, Immersive Labs' network severed all schools' connections and the Challenge had to be closed without a confirmed winner. Nonetheless, our students enjoyed the competition and learned new ethical hacking skills.

Immersive Labs are offering free use of their Student Digital Cyber Academy as a prize for those that took part in the Unlock Cyber Challenge labs for one whole year, a great opportunity from a company described as "the world's leader in providing cyber training for employers".

Well done Year 8!
