It has been a privilege to serve the families and children in five Catholic schools in the south-east of England, London and in the valleys of South

Wales before ending my career in Bristol. I have been supported by families, worked with outstanding colleagues and been humbled by inspiring young people – and learnt from them every day. Teaching has certainly given me the opportunity to influence the lives of students - many of whom have gone on to do great work in their chosen specialist fields.

Having spent twenty-one years as a senior leader across the schools and the last four years as Principal of St Bede's Catholic College has enabled me to fulfil my vocation as a teacher - a vocation grounded in faith and in the desire for every student to be the very best version of themselves that they can be.

I would like to say a special 'thank you' to everyone for your

continued support and encourage you to accept the challenges that life brings you, with courage and never fearing what the future may hold.

Last week I was delighted to receive an Apostolic Blessing from the Holy Father Francis in recognition of the 35 years of dedication to Catholic Education. The Blessing was presented by Bishop Declan during a special Mass.

I wish everyone at St Bede's continued success and am confident that the College will continue to thrive in the years to come.

REFLECTION – **15 July** This week we celebrate the feast day of St. Bonaventure

St. Bonaventure is a Bishop and Doctor of the Church whose Feast day is celebrated on July 15.

St. Bonaventure, known as "the seraphic doctor," was born at Bagnoregio, in the Lazio region of central Italy, in 1221. He received the name of Bonaventure in consequence of an exclamation of St. Francis of Assisi, when, in response to the pleading of the child's mother, the saint prayed for John's recovery from a dangerous illness, and, foreseeing the future greatness of the little John, cried out "O Buona ventura"-O good fortune!



At the age of 22, Bonaventure entered the Franciscan order and by the age of 35 was General of the Order. As General, he composed 'The life of St Francis.' He was a scholastic theologian, philosopher and Cardinal Bishop of Allbano.

Reflection: "In all your deeds and words, you should look upon this Jesus, as your model. Do so, whether you are walking or keeping silence, or speaking, whether you are alone or with others. He is perfect and thus, you will be, not only irreprehensible but praiseworthy." St Bonaventure

CHEMISTRY COMPETITION

Earlier this term, ten Year 12 students participated in the Cambridge Chemistry Challenge Lower 6th competition. The competition is a written paper which is ideal for challenging all students taking A Level Chemistry, in particular the most able.

Congratulations to James Moss, Neha Jegison and George Herron who achieved excellent results and were awarded a Copper certificate. All other participants came very close, with a few only missing out on a certificate by a single mark!

Only 33% of students across the country entering this competition were awarded this certificate, which represents a firm grasp of A Level material and the ability to apply this knowledge to novel problems, so this is a fantastic achievement!



Please be aware of a new platform called **Monkey Web**, that presents a risk to children and young people. We have been alerted to an extremely dangerous website and app called '**Monkey**', which allows users to have video calls with strangers. The platform markets itself as 'an alternative to *Omegle*, with a *TikTok vibe*' and therefore may potentially seem attractive to your children. Experts from our safeguarding partners have reviewed and reviewed this platform and have found that it contains large amounts of inappropriate, disturbing, and harmful content transmitted via web cameras.

SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

Sun safety

NHS Advice for adults and children on sunscreen and sun safety in the UK and abroad.

Sunburn doesn't just happen on holiday - you can burn in the UK,

even when it's cloudy. There's no safe or healthy way to get a tan. A tan doesn't protect your skin from the sun's harmful effects. Aim to strike a balance between protecting yourself from the sun and getting enough vitamin D from sunlight. Sunburn increases your risk of skin cancer.

Sun safety tips

- spend time in the shade when the sun is strongest. In the UK, this is between 11am and 3pm, March to October
- make sure you never burn
- take extra care with children

Wear Sun-Screen

• Don't rely on sunscreen alone to protect yourself from the sun - cover up with suitable clothing.

When buying sunscreen, the label should have:

- a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15 to protect against UVB
- at least four-star UVA protection
- Make sure the <u>sunscreen is not past its expiry date</u>. Most sunscreens have a shelf life of two to three years.




St Bede's Library Summer Newsletter
