REFLECTION

The feast day of St Matthew is celebrated on September 21

Matthew was an apostle who was also called Levi, or Matthew the Levite. He was probably born in Galilee and worked as a tax collector at Capernaum when Christ called him to follow him.

Matthew was the author of the first Gospel, written between 60 and 90.

Matthew preached in Jerusalem and then went to Ethiopia, where he was martyred in Persia (modern Iran) or in Ethiopia. Matthew provides a telling portrait of Christ in his Gospel, including his genealogy, ministry, Passion, and Resurrection. The entire work is designed to provide a true recognition of Christ as the Messiah.

Reflection: Matthew 9:9-13

As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. "Follow me," he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him.

While Jesus was having dinner at Matthew's house, many tax collectors and sinners came and ate with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they asked his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

On hearing this, Jesus said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."


God of Mercy

ST BEDE'S SUPPORT FOR WORLD COMMUNITY GRID

World Community Grid is an initiative of IBM Corporate Citizenship which donates its technology and talent to address some of the world's most pressing social and environmental issues and helps in the research of cancer, TB, Covid 19, sustainable water, clean energy and many others.

Their research partners have completed the equivalent of hundreds of thousands of years of research in less than a decade and there are currently over 800,000 members worldwide running World Community Grid on over 7.5 million devices.

As an example, in 2014 the research team behind the Help Fight Childhood Cancer project published a paper on their discovery of seven promising drug candidates to treat neuroblastoma, one of the most common and dangerous forms of childhood cancer. This work consists of 9 million virtual chemistry experiments, each of which would take hours to perform on a single computer, totalling over **8,000** years of computer time. World Community Grid is performing these computations in parallel and the project is expected to be completed in two years or less.

By installing a client and downloading small pieces of data, World Community Grid utilises your PC to process and send back the data while it is idle. As soon as your computer is in use again, the processing stops. There is no impact on your PC's performance and you'd never know the client was running.

Rather than recycling our old servers, St Bede's have been using them to support World Community Grid. Since 2016, St Bede's have run the equivalent of 105 years' worth of data processing and are currently part of the Open Pandemics, Africa Rainfall, Help Stop TB, Mapping Cancer markers and Smash Childhood Cancer projects.
