## REFLECTION 4 May – The English Martyrs

Last week, we celebrated the feast of the English Martyrs.

The English Martyrs are a group of Roman Catholic martyrs executed by English authorities during the Reformation, most during the reign of Elizabeth I.



An act of Parliament in 1571 made it high treason to question the queen's title as head of the Church of England, thus making the practice of Roman Catholicism an essentially treasonable act and authorized the confiscation of the property of Roman Catholics, many of whom fled to the European continent. In the ensuing persecution, 183 English Catholics were put to death between 1577 and 1603; altogether, some 600 Catholics died in the persecutions of the 16th and 17th centuries.

Forty of these victims were canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1970 as representatives of all the martyrs, including St. Margaret Clitherow, St. Cuthbert Mayne, and St. Edmund Campion.

In 1987 Pope John Paul II beatified an additional 85 martyrs who died between 1584 and 1689 in England, Scotland, and Wales. Many were priests or members of religious orders, but 59 including seven of those canonized were lay Catholics.

**Reflection:** "I am a Catholic man and a priest; in that faith I have lived and on that faith do I intend to die. If you esteem my religion treason, then I am guilty; as for the other treason, I never committed any, God is my judge." St Edmund Campion, one of the Martyrs

**Prayer:** Almighty God, who in our country raised up martyrs from every walk of life to vindicate the authority of Your Church in teaching and worship, grant through their intercession, we pray, that all our people may be gathered once again to celebrate the same sacraments under the one Shepherd, Jesus Christ Your Son. Amen.

Congratulations to **Seacole** House who were victorious in the recent inter house boys Basketball competition and **Descartes** who won the inter house girls football.




# Living with COVID-19: advice for those aged 18 and under

Has your child or young person aged 18 or under tested positive, or do they feel unwell with COVID-19 or flu-like symptoms? If so, there are a few simple steps they can take to protect their family and community – especially those at highest risk of severe illness.









**Try to stay at home,** avoid contact with others and follow the guidance on **gov.uk** 



Try to avoid going to school, college or childcare until they no longer have a high temperature and are well enough to return





Carry on attending as normal if they only have mild symptoms like a runny nose, sore throat or slight cough and otherwise feel well



If they have had a positive test for COVID-19, they should:



**Try to stay at home,** avoid contact with others for 3 days and follow the guidance on **gov.uk** 



Try to avoid going to school, college or childcare during this time, where they can



Go back after 3 days, but only if they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to do so

### SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

A recent report by Ofcom highlighted that over half of 3-17-year-olds are using TikTok.

### What is TikTok?

TikTok is a video-sharing platform where you can watch and create videos, and livestream. The app has an age-rating of 13+.

Users can browse different videos on TikTok via a personalised feed known as the 'For You Page'. You can also search for content using topics or hashtags.

### Is TikTok safe for children?

TikTok can be a creative outlet for young people as it allows them to learn about video editing and discover new interests.

However, it can be easy for children and young people to come across inappropriate content on the app.

Because TikTok uses algorithms to show users new content, it's easy for young people to come across inappropriate or upsetting videos. The platform also has communication features that allow users to privately message each other which could put your child at risk of being contacted by someone they don't know.

### How to keep your child safe on TikTok using safety settings

There are six security settings that can help you to keep TikTok safe for your child and prevent them seeing anything that might worry or upset them:

### **Family Pairing**

This allows you to connect your child's account with your own. It gives you access to parental controls to help manage who they can speak to and how long they can spend on the app.

### Private account

Setting your child's account to private means that only approved followers will be able to watch their videos.

### Restricted mode

This feature helps to filter out videos that may contain inappropriate or adult topics and stop them appearing on your child's 'For You Page'.

### **Comment filters**

Enable to manage who can comment on your child's videos and stop inappropriate comments from appearing on their feed.

### Direct messages

This can help them manage who can contact them privately on the app. You can choose who can send them direct messages by selecting 'Friends only' or 'No one'.

#### Daily screen time

This setting allows you manage how long your child can spend on the app. You can set a daily time limit, and once it's up you'll need to enter a passcode to keep using the platform.
