MESSAGE FROM MR KING, PRINCIPAL

I am pleased to be able to formally announce the next exciting step in the journey of our Areté sixth form. As you know, St Bede's moved from seven form entry (180 students) to eight form entry (207 students) in September 2018, at the request of Bristol City Council.

This change was designed to help ease the pressure that was building in the city on secondary school places. This means the college's first bigger cohort will be finishing Year 11 in the summer of 2023. Our current sixth form buildings will therefore not be big enough to take the larger cohort in September 2023 and the further growth expected in September 2024. The governors have agreed to construct a new building beside our current sixth form building to increase capacity with a summer of 2023 deadline.

We believe that the physical environment has a direct impact on the quality of education. St Bede's has always prided itself on building and maintaining high quality buildings, classrooms and other educational workspaces and this project is no different. The new building will provide an inspirational space in which students and future students can aspire to greatness, whilst also providing the quality practical space to excel.

I include some diagrams below to give you a flavour of what is planned.

REFLECTION 6 July – St Maria Goretti

This week, we celebrate the feast of St Maria Goretti

Maria had been born into a Catholic family in 1890. Her family was very poor, but her family's love for God never wavered. Every day Maria's mother and brothers and sisters went



out into the fields to work. Maria stayed behind and took care of all the household responsibilities including taking care of the youngest child, Teresa.

When she was 12, a young man she knew, Alessandro, snuck up on her and began to attack her.

"No, no you mustn't! What you are doing is a sin!" screamed Maria.

Alessandro stabbed her many times. A couple of days later she died from those wounds. Before she died, she forgave her attacker and promised to pray for him. She said: "I forgive Alessandro Serenelli...and I want him with me in heaven forever."

After Alessandro attacked Maria, he was captured and sent to prison for thirty years. At first he wasn't sorry for his sin. Then one day he had a dream. In the dream, he was sitting in a garden with Maria and she gave him a bunch of lilies. When he took them, the flowers burned his hands. Upon awakening, Alessandro was a changed man, sorry for his sins.

On June 24, 1950 Maria Goretti was declared a saint by Pope Pius XII.

CYBER TASTER DAY

On Monday 27 June, thirteen of our Year 9 students attended the Cyber Taster Day hosted by the University of the West of England in its high tech School of Engineering Building.

A total of 21 schools from the south west of England participated in the event and all participating students got the opportunity to attend a range of cyber security workshops run by local and national employers and educators.

St Bede's students' workshops covered cyber topics such as hacking (both ethical and

criminal), encryption, coding, digital forensics, wiretapping and data phishing delivered by cyber specialists from companies including BAE Systems, BT PwC, JP Morgan and Harareaves Security, Lansdown. Our students also attended a presentation on Cyber Ethics delivered by the South West Regional Cyber Crime Unit and Mr Bogle has decided on a late career change after attending a teachers' workshop on careers in the cyber security sector which highlighted the eye-watering salaries



available in this rapidly growing and under staffed ^{St Bede's students participating in Leonardo's industry.}

When asked for feedback on their trip, the students used terms such 'stunning', as 'unbelievable' and 'brilliant' with Annette Siby statina that it was "once-in-a-lifetime a opportunity to try some amazing workshops staffed by friendly experts who also gave us great goody bags to take away too". This was the first time UWE were able to host a live Cyber Taster Day in three years following the Covid restrictions and the organisers should take credit for arranging such a high class event for our aspiring students.

ECO CLUB

During the last couple of months, Eco-club has made good progress and in particular with our efforts to get the ground ready in our garden. The students have shown real commitment in establishing the garden



which started as a bare patch which they have now composted and planted with flowers and vegetables including spinach, radishes, sunflowers and nasturtiums.

With some great support from Ms Sanders, the seeds were planted in smaller pots to begin with, to allow the students to nurture them ready for transferring to the main garden.

We have also planted potatoes in pots which are growing successfully as we speak. This planting exercise helps the students to understand the importance of biodiversity and also how growing your own food locally can have a positive impact on the environment. Once the plants are fully grown, the students will be able to take them home to enjoy. We are now looking ahead to plan activities for the Autumn in the new academic year.


