CAMBRIDGE CHEMISTRY CHALLENGE

This term some Year 12 chemistry students have been taking part in the 'Cambridge Chemistry Challenge'. This is an Olympiad style competition which is specifically tailored for the Year 12 curriculum – providing an extra challenge to our most able students. This competition aims to stretch and challenge students interested in chemistry, taking them significantly beyond the syllabus and encourages them to think about the subject in the way they would at university.

When the students first encountered a past paper, the questions were very difficult and initially they all felt very daunted by the prospect of taking part. However, with a lot of hard work and preparation I'm happy to say that this year's cohort achieved the best results ever from St Bede's!

Overall 7 students received a certificate – including one student in the top 10% and one student in the top 1% nationally! We are incredibly proud of their hard work and effort that led to the achievements of all those who took part.

Louis worked incredibly hard to prepare for the exam and it is clear that the many hours of practice and preparation paid off.



Course places are subject to spaces in the class being available, as well as entry requirements. Please enrol early to avoid disappointment.

For students who have not met the Areté entry requirements for the subjects they would like to study, there will be a slip in the results envelope asking you to stay on the College site for further discussion in E5 (the computer suite)

SKY ACADEMY STUDIOS, LONDON

As the reward for three of our Year 9 students winning the runners up spot for The Edit competition, one of the competition's sponsors, Sky, provided an all expenses paid trip to Sky Academy Studios in West London on Friday 15 July.

The trip coincided with the final day of St Bede's Enrichment programme and Mr Bogle and Miss Mounter accompanied 32 Year 9 students on a



fantastic opportunity to see the inner workings of a professional production company.



On a very warm day, it was great to see that Sky had booked an executive coach to transport us to London in the comfort and style that set a precedent for the whole trip! On arriving at Sky's sprawling Headquarters, we discovered we had been assigned our own security chaperone to accompany us for the day and on our tour he proudly pointed out the locations of the studios that broadcast Sky's live content.

Before we were taken to Sky's innovation centre, our students were visibly excited when the Sky personnel forewarned us that we may see well known people and celebrities on site as they are involved in the production of Sky's media output.

At Sky's innovation centre, we were given a demonstration of Sky's Glass TV which employs 360° Dolby Atmos sound and Quantum Dot technology and then we were shown a mockup of the green screen pods that are used by Sky Sports presenters on location. Mr Bogle got the opportunity to be superimposed as a special guest on a Super Sunday clip alongside a trio of Sky Sports presenters including Graham Souness and Alex Scott. Our students were then split into four teams and allocated film production roles as actors, directors, video editors, producers and camera operators. Each team had their own purpose built recording studio, access to an adjoining wardrobe and dressing room and a Sky trainer to help them plan, film and edit their own film trailers. Our students clearly had fun making their trailers and gained an invaluable insight into some of the career opportunities available in the visual media industry.

The visit ended with a presentation of the film trailers that our students had created and before leaving, we visited the viewing gallery for Sky News where we could see the presenters and camera operators producing a live news broadcast. The Sky production

team were really impressed with our students' enthusiasm and their willingness to engage with the production process and our students really enjoyed the experience of working with high-end technology in an impressive setting.

SUN SAFETY

NHS Advice for adults and children on sunscreen and sun safety in the UK and abroad.

Sunburn doesn't just happen on holiday – you can burn in the UK, even when it's cloudy. There's no safe or healthy way to get a tan. A tan doesn't protect your skin from the sun's harmful effects. Aim to strike a balance between protecting yourself from the sun and <u>getting enough vitamin D</u> from sunlight. Sunburn increases your risk of skin cancer.



- spend time in the shade when the sun is strongest. In the UK, this is between 11am and 3pm, March to October
- make sure you never burn
- take extra care with children

Wear Sun-Screen

- Don't rely on sunscreen alone to protect yourself from the sun cover up with suitable clothing.
- When buying sunscreen, the label should have: a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15 to protect against UVB at least four-star UVA protection
- Make sure the <u>sunscreen is not past its expiry date</u>. Most sunscreens have a shelf life of two to three years.
