#### REFLECTION—23 September—Feast Day of St. Pio of Petrelcina

We mark the feast day of our Seacole House Saint. The Catholic Church remembers the Italian Franciscan priest St. Pio of Petrelcina, better known as "Padre Pio" and known for his suffering, humility and miracles.



This famous saint is well known helping people from all over the world to get closer to God through the Sacrament of reconciliation. He helped the poor, founded a hospital and many prayer groups. Padre Pio is well known for his stigmata (red marks) on the palms of his hands. After World War I he started to miraculously experience the stigmata, meaning he suffered the same wounds that Christ suffered during the crucifixion. This miracle made Padre Pio very famous. He heard confessions of pilgrims from all over Europe for 10-12 hours a day and responded to letters late into each night. Out of fear that the miraculous stories about him were untrue, the pope placed restrictions on his ministry for years. All evidence showed, however, that the miracles surrounding his life, including the stigmata, were true. Devotion to Padre Pio grew even greater after his death in 1968 and canonization in 2002.

#### CASHLESS CATERING

SCOPAY is now running properly so we urge all parents to use the website to add monies to their child(ren)'s account, as it is the most secure option. If your child(ren) have free School Meals please also check that they have not overspent their allocation and, if required, top up where necessary.

We are aware that some parents do not want their child(ren) to access the canteen food, or do not want them to be able to overspend. If this is you please can you contact finance@stbcc.org with details of the Child(ren) in question, whether you want your child to access the canteen food at all, the maximum daily amount you want them to be able to spend. e.g the FSM allocation only ( $\pounds$ 2.75), whether you are happy for them to go into arrears and to what extent.

Please remember if you set a limit then you will need to ensure there are sufficient funds on the account to enable them to eat. There is an APP which is available that your child could access to enable them to check, before school, how much is on their account. If you want this facility please contact the finance office at finance@stbcc.org,

You should be aware that if you add money on SCOPAY it will take up to 45 minutes before it appears on your child(ren)'s account(s) so please be sure to add funds by 10.00am for breaktime and by 11.30 for lunchtime.

#### SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT

Research published by the UK Safer Internet Centre highlighted that 78 percent of 8-17 year olds have received a friend request from someone they don't know, and 68 per cent have experienced offensive or mean comments from other players and social media users.

Setting up controls and individual safety settings on a child's favourite app or game, is one of the ways that parents and carers can help to keep children safe and stop unwanted contact from people they don't know.
