REFLECTION—22nd July Feast of St Mary Magdalene

St. Mary Magdalene is one of the greatest saints of the Bible and a legendary example of God's mercy and grace. The precise dates of her birth and death are unknown, but it is known that she was present with Christ during his public ministry, death and resurrection. She is mentioned at least a dozen times in the Gospels.

The Gospels agree that Mary was originally a great sinner. Jesus cast seven demons out of her when he met her. After this, she told several women she associated with and these women also became followers.



During Jesus' ministry, it is believed that Mary Magdalene followed him, part of a semipermanent entourage who served Jesus and his Disciples.

Mary likely watched the crucifixion from a distance along with the other women who followed Christ during His ministry. Mary was present when Christ rose from the dead, visiting his tomb to anoint his body only to find the stone rolled away and Christ, very much alive, sitting at the place they laid Him. She was the first witness to His resurrection.

In the next newsletter we look forward to sharing with you the names of the new staff who will be joining us.


ST BEDE'S WAY SPOTLIGHT Work Hard, Be Kind and Do the Right Thing

GCSE Results can be collected from the college between 9.00am—11.00am

Sixth Form Enrolment and confirmation of your place within the Sixth Form will happen on Thursday 24th August, once you have collected your GCSE results.

Where students have met the entry requirements for the Sixth Form and the subjects they have selected to study, there will be an online form to complete from home. Entry requirements can be found under the Sixth Form tab on our website. Enrolment will close at 4pm on Friday 25th August. Please ensure you have enrolled by this deadline in order to secure your place. Late applications to enrol will only be accepted subject to the availability of places and we are expecting to be oversubscribed this year so encourage you to enrol early. Course places are subject to spaces in the class being available, as well as entry requirements. Please enrol early to avoid disappointment.

For students who have not met the Areté entry requirements for the subjects they would like to study, there will be a slip in the results envelope asking you to stay on the College site for further discussion in E5 (the computer suite)

CAMBRIDGE CHEMISTRY CHALLENGE

This term some Year 12 chemistry students have been taking part in the 'Cambridge Chemistry Challenge' This is an Olympiad style competition which is specifically tailored for the Year 12 curriculum – providing an extra challenge to our most able students. This competition aims to stretch and challenge students interested in chemistry, taking them significantly beyond the syllabus and encourages them to think about the subject in the way they would at university.

When the students first encountered a past paper, the questions were very difficult and initially they all felt very daunted by the prospect of taking part. However, with a lot of hard work and preparation we were delighted that this year's cohort achieved the best results ever from St Bede's!

In total, 8 students received a certificate – including two students who came in the top 10% nationally. We incredibly are proud of their hard work and effort that led to the achievements of all those who took part. These students will now be looking ahead to compete in Chemistry Olympiad the in January, where we hope they can repeat their success!

SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT SUN SAFETY



NHS Advice for adults and children on sunscreen and sun safety in the UK and abroad.

Sunburn doesn't just happen on holiday – you can burn in the UK, even when it's cloudy. There's no safe or healthy way to get a tan. A tan doesn't protect your skin from the sun's harmful effects. Aim to strike a balance between protecting yourself from the sun and getting enough vitamin D from sunlight. Sunburn increases your risk of skin cancer.

Sun safety tips

- spend time in the shade when the sun is strongest. In the UK, this is between 11am and 3pm, March to October
- make sure you never burn
- take extra care with children

Wear Sun-Screen

- Don't rely on sunscreen alone to protect yourself from the sun cover up with suitable clothing.
- When buying sunscreen, the label should have: a sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 15 to protect against UVB at least four-star UVA protection
- Make sure the <u>sunscreen is not past its expiry date</u>. Most sunscreens have a shelf life of two to three years.

ST BEDE'S HAS REDUCED ITS CARBON FOOTPRINT!

A new heating system was introduced at St Bede's in March 2022, which uses solar panels to generate power instead of using our old oil powered boiler.

Now the first year is complete, we have calculated we have s a v e d 1 4 7 t o n n e s of CO2 equivalent. These emissions are the same as driving 882,000 miles in a diesel car.

We are proud of this improvement, but continue to look for ways to make the college more sustainable.

LUNCH MEALS NEW PRICES FOR SEPTEMBER 2023

The college's catering provider, Chartwells, has updated us with the prices for lunch meals from 1st September 2023. Other items will rise by a similar percentage.

Main meals, including halal and special diet meals, will now be $\pounds 2.75$. The Free School Meal allowance is also to a maximum of $\pounds 2.75$


