BEST PROGRESS SCORE IN BRISTOL

Congratulations to students and staff
Year 11 from summer 2023
achieved the best progress of any school in Bristol!

Progress 8 is the national measure of progress – how much better than similar students in other schools do our children perform.

The Institute of Fiscal Studies recently reported that Progress 8 was a "reliable measure of school effectiveness" and should be considered when making secondary school applications.

Our score of 0.57 puts **St Bede's in the highest Department for Education band**, "**Well above average**", top for all Bristol schools and well into the top 10% of schools nationally.

It means that our children, on average, achieved over half a grade higher in each subject than similar students in the average school.

REFLECTION – 22 OCTOBER ST JOHN PAUL II

Pope John Paul II was the head of the Catholic Church from 16 October 1978 to his death in 2005. He was the second longest-serving pope in history. As a Pole, he was the first non-Italian pope in 455 years.

Full Governing Body meetings and committee meetings are held 3 times a year, during the day.








YEAR 7 ADMISSIONS SEPTEMBER 2024

Parents/carers of any Year 6 children (born between 1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013) wishing to join St Bede's Catholic College are reminded that now is the time to apply for their secondary school place for September 2024. To make your application:

- 1. you **must** complete the secondary transfer **application** form provided by your home Local Authority (available on the **LA** website) by 31 October, **and:**
- 2. if you are applying for a baptised Catholic child or for child of another faith denomination, you should **also** complete a Supplementary Information Form (available on **our** website) and provide a copy of your child's baptism certificate/proof of membership, also by 31 October.

Key safety measures when travelling to and from college

WEARING SEATBELTS

The only exemption to this rule is for buses that are designed for urban use, such as buses that have room for passengers to stand and are used for short journeys, in both time and distance and are undertaken at moderate speeds on urban routes.


This means that buses that travel on the motorway, dual carriageway or country roads, are legally required to have seat belts.


