#### **BRISTOL ENTHUSE STEM CHALLENGE**

On Thursday 7th December two teams of 5 students set out for the Enthuse STEM event. The task for the day was to come up with an innovative solution to help Bristol achieve its goal of being carbon neutral by 2030.

Working collaboratively, the teams researched the Globally agreed Sustainable Development Goals (<a href="https://sdgs.un.org/goals">https://sdgs.un.org/goals</a>) and ways to reduce nett Carbon emissions.

The St Bede's teams had several innovative ideas with one team focusing on trying to encourage supermarkets to be more sustainable and using tax income to fund projects that promote sustainability, and the other team coming up with "liquid trees" as a solution for reducing CO 2 in the atmosphere by using microalgae in tanks around the city.

These ideas were researched in depth and at the end of the day all the teams had to present them, Dragons Den style, to everyone including a team of judges from sponsors *Jacobs*.

The St Bede's pupils all gave outstanding performances, presenting their ideas clearly and coherently. The liquid trees idea really captured the imaginations of the judges and lead to the



team consisting of **Bradley**, **Finnian**, **Dominik**, **Eric** and **Albert** winning the first round.

Both teams have made it through to the second round where teams will have to develop their principal idea. The overall winners will get to visit the Jacobs Headquarters in July 2024.

Congratulations to all the St Bede's pupils that took part – Not only did they do an amazing job researching and presenting, they also represented the St Bede's values in exemplary fashion.
