GCSE AND A LEVEL DRAMA THEATRE TRIPS


Last week our GCSE and A Level Drama students embarked on enriching theatrical experiences.

SAFEGUARDING SPOTLIGHT Measles outbreaks

The Department for Education have confirmed the recent news stories that there have been recent localised outbreaks of measles centred around the West Midlands. There is a risk of further outbreaks in other areas unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination take up in areas with low MMR vaccine rates.

Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. The best protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine. It is never too late to have these vaccinations.


Year 5 and 6 Netball Qualification Event
