MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL

It was a privilege to be a part of two wonderful services this fortnight. Last week, we gathered to reflect on the life of Jacob Browse, one year on from his passing. Students shared poems and memories.

This week, Year 7 had their own Mass, which gave them a chance to reflect on their first six months at St Bede's as well as on the life of their patron saint, St Josephine Bakhita. St Josephine was enslaved as a child and came to faith when with the Canossian Sisters in Venice. Her story of hardship, faith and forgiveness is truly inspirational.

Last week was also our second annual Culture Week. This was a fantastic opportunity to share food, games, music, fashion and dance, highlighting the great cultural diversity that makes St Bede's such a special place. The student Culture Committee spent time planning the exciting events, and students across the college dedicated themselves to preparing for and taking part in the activities. I am proud of them all.

ST BEDE'S SPOTLIGHT Work Hard, Be Kind and Do the Right Thing

The St. Bede's Way Spotlight identifies someone who stands out as exemplifying one of our three St Bede's Way principles of "Work Hard. Be Kind. Do the Right Thing."

This week the spotlight falls on year 8 student Oliver who was our highest scoring participant in this year's Oxford University Computational Challenge.

The challenge was open to the top 10% of the participants in the UK Bebras Computational Thinking Challenge held last November.

Just over 450 of St. Bede's ICT students participated in the Junior and Intermediate Bebras Challenges for Years 7 to 9 which had a record 330,000 participants from the UK and overseas.

This is the second year in a row that Oliver has been our highest scoring participant in the OUCC. Congratulations!

Oliver, your hard work exemplifies one of our St Bede's Way principles, we are so proud of you.



REFLECTION – St Josephine Bakhita

This week we celebrate the feast day of St Josephine Bakhita on 8 February

St Josephine was born in the Sudan, East Africa, in 1869.

Between the ages of 7 to 9 she was kidnapped and sold into slavery. Some Owners were kind; however, others were cruel and Josephine was sometimes treated badly.

Josephine worked for an Italian official who

brought her to Italy to care for his children. While the family was on holiday Josephine went to stay with the Canossian Sisters in Venice. Here she was very touched by the faith, hope and love of the Sisters.

Josephine made up her own mind to follow Jesus by offering hospitality to people who visited their convent, being kind to all people and making sure the convent and school were places of safety, harmony and joy.

In 2000 Josephine was declared a saint by the Catholic church. She is remembered as a woman of faith and forgiveness, courage and compassion.

At her canonization ceremony on October 1, 2000, Pope John Paul II said of St. Josephine: "The history of her life inspires not passive acceptance but the firm resolve to work effectively to free girls and women from oppression and violence..."

Reflection:

"If I were to meet the slave-traders who kidnapped me and even those who tortured me, I would kneel and kiss their hands, for if that did not happen, I would not be a Christian and Religious today...." St Josephine Bakhita

Prayer: Prayer to St Josephine Bakhita

St. Josephine Bakhita, you were sold into slavery as a child and endured untold hardship and suffering.

Assist all those who are trapped in a state of slavery; intercede with God on their behalf so that they will be released from their chains of captivity.

Provide comfort to survivors of slavery and let them look to you as an example of hope Help all survivors find healing from their wounds.

Amen.

INCLUSIVE SPORTS LEADERSHIP TRAINING DAY

On Friday 26th January, thirteen Year 10 students went to SBL Academy for the Youth Sport Trust (YST) Young Leaders training day led by YST Lead Inclusion School Warmley Park.

Students worked hard to develop their social and inclusive skills through the power of sports leadership. Working with



students from other schools, they were able to tailor different sport activities and games to ensure they are inclusive for all and to support those with a disability.

They also learnt the STEP Model effectively when planning and delivering sport to promote inclusion.

LECTURE BY DR LISA MOTT

On Monday 29th January Year 12 and Year 13 maths students attended an online lecture by Dr Lisa Mott, Assistant Professor at the University of Nottingham.

Students explored Statistical Hypothesis Testing and the uses for it in different careers.

The lecture proved to be really interesting and engaging for the students and they learnt more about why we study certain topics at A-level. For example, the use of hypothesis testing on MRI images and exploring whether different regions of the brain are connected.

ATTENDANCE WHAT TO DO GUIDANCE

Daily Unplanned Absence:

Contact either the absence line or send a message through MyED app.

Contact the absence line 01173772200 Selecting option 1 (main school) or option 2 (sixth form) and leave a voicemail giving students full name, tutor group and the specific reason for absence.

Or send us a message through MyED app please once again give the specific reason for absence.

Supporting evidence may be requested depending on the student's overall attendance and the length of the absence.

Appointments:

It is expected that appointments should be made outside of college hours. If this is not possible you may be required to provide evidence of the appointment to consider authorising the absence. Absences will also not be considered if we are not advised about them via the MyEd app or ringing the main college line and leaving a message in option 1.

Please contact either the absence line or send a message through MyED app stating what kind of appointment it is, what the time of the appointment is and if they will be required to leave college early or will be in late.

If the appointment requires the student to leave college early you are also required to send an email to pupilsupport@stbcc.org stating the time that you give permission for them to leave college, the reason why they need to leave and if you are unable to collect them in person that you take full responsibility for them once they leave the college premises. Without this email we are unable to allow the student to leave the college premises without a parent/guardian picking them up.

Planned Absence or Emergency Absences:

If you are planning any absence from college, please download the request for absence form from the website. Please complete this with as much information as possible to support the absence.

If it is an emergency, you will still need to download the form and return it to the college, you may also be asked to provide supporting evidence to show that it was not a preplanned absence.


