We are sure that this experience will help them with future speaking opportunities at University and beyond. Well done.








REFLECTION 19 March – St Joseph, the husband of the Virgin Mary Next week we celebrate the solemnity of St Joseph

St Joseph was the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus. Not a great deal is known about him other than he was a carpenter.

What we do know is that, Joseph was a compassionate, caring man. When he discovered Mary was pregnant after they had been betrothed, he knew the child was not his but was as yet unaware that she was carrying the Son of God. He knew women accused of adultery could be stoned to death, so he resolved to send her away quietly to not expose her to shame or cruelty. Saint Joseph, patron of the universal Church, watch over the Church as carefully as you watched over Jesus, help protect it and guide it as you did with your adopted son. Amen


VISIT TO UNIVERSITY OF BRISTOL

On Friday 1st March three year 12 Geography students, **Eleri, Toby** and **Sebastian** visited the University of Bristol to spend the day with geography students from other schools in the region.

The day was based around the Regeneration of the Temple Quarter Region. They listened to talks from university lecturers on the regeneration and resurgence of Bristol, and the importance of this to the area we live in. There was also an interesting presentation from a representative of the Temple Regeneration Scheme.

All schools were then tasked to create a presentation on what they thought should be built on the Temple Quarter Island. Eleri, Toby and Sebastian's plan was to build a conference and restaurant facility with unique shops located below, with the development surrounded by green space.

Their plan, poster and presentation won them the competition. Overall the three students learnt a lot about Geography at university and the many different career paths it can lead to.



VISIT TO PARLIAMENT

On Thursday 29th February, thirty Areté students took part in the annual London Trip to Parliament.

When we arrived, students had a photo outside the Supreme Court of Justice before making our way to Parliament.

Students were taken on a guided tour around the Palace of Westminster including watching a heated live debate in the House of Commons regarding the Angiolini Inquiry (about the safety of women after the death of Sarah Everard)



We also visited Westminster Hall, which is 1000 years old. You may have seen this part of Parliament on TV as it is where the Queen was laid in state.

Students then took part in a workshop on how laws are made and had to follow the protocols that MPs and Peers use when in debates in each house. We finished the day by visiting the Victoria and Albert Museum, which is the world's largest museum of applied arts, decorative arts and design, housing a permanent collection of over 2.27 million objects.




