MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL

It was wonderful to formally open the St Oscar Romero Building last Tuesday when Bishop Declan came to bless the building. We also welcomed student representatives, local priests, governors, the architects, and some previous members of the college leadership team to celebrate the occasion. The college has come a long way from 2013 when only 21 students joined our first Year 12 group. We now have 135 in Year 12 and expect 150 students to join us in September 2024.



I was also delighted this week that St Bede's has been recognised by the Schools, Students and Teachers Network (SSAT) for being in the top 10% of non-selective schools nationally for student attainment in the 2023 end of KS4 exams. This is a great testament to the high quality teaching that the students receive, as well as the hard work and dedication the students themselves put into their academic studies.

What is Holy Week?

Holy Week recounts the final days of Jesus' life including his death, burial, and resurrection.

What is Palm Sunday?

Jesus rode on a donkey into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. The people waved branches at him, shouting, "Hosanna".

Let's reflect

What would it be like to be in the crowd that welcomed Jesus to Jerusalem? How can I welcome Jesus today?

What is Maundy Thursday?

Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his friends. He washed their feet which was usually the job of a servant. Then he broke bread saying 'This is my body' and shared wine saying 'This is my blood.' This was on Maundy Thursday.

Let's reflect

How would feel to have someone as important as Jesus washing my feet? How can I serve people humbly like Jesus?

What is Good Friday?

Jesus was arrested and crucified on Good Friday. Even on the Cross he forgave the people who were hurting him.

Let's reflect

How does it feel to know Jesus is always loving and forgiving? How can I be forgiving?

What is Easter Sunday?

After the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices to go and anoint the body of Jesus.

Very early on Sunday morning, at sunrise, they went to the tomb. On the way they said to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" (It was a very large stone.) Then they looked up and saw that the stone had already been rolled back. So they entered the tomb, where they saw a young man sitting at the right, wearing a white robe—and they were alarmed.

"Don't be alarmed," he said. "I know you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is not here—he has been raised! Look, here is the place where he was placed. Now go and give this message to his disciples, including Peter: 'He is going to Galilee ahead of you; there you will see him, just as he told you.'"

Jesus' death show us how much God loves everyone.

His resurrection reminds us that even in the most difficult situations there is always hope.

Reflection: "Holy Week is a privileged time when we are called to draw near to Jesus: friendship with him is shown in times of difficulty." ~ **Pope Francis**

Prayer: Give me grace and mercy as I try and fail, guidance when I'm not sure which way to go, and wisdom to trust you in all things. For your love brings light and life to all who seek it. May I seek you evermore as I walk with you through this Holy Week and beyond. **Amen.**

FIN SWIMMING WORLD CUP

Congratulations to year 10 students **Annie** and **Edie** who **represented Great Britain at the Fin Swimming CMAS World Cup 2024** in Italy last week.

Edie raced in three individual events, and Annie raced in four individual races and the in the under 18's relay team. In the 50m bi-fin race **Annie broke the current GB record** for under 15 year olds.

Fin Swimming is different to traditional swimming competitions as the swimmers use either bi-fins or a mono-fin and most races are swum completely underwater using a snorkel to breathe. They are much faster than normal races, but you have extra weight to carry as a mono-fin is 3kg. Both girls swim for Neptune Fin Swimming Club in Bristol.

We are delighted that our excellent outcomes have been recognised by SSAT (The Schools, Students and Teachers Network) in this year's Educational Outcomes Awards. The award recognises that St Bede's is among the highest performing secondary schools in the country, based on 2023 performance data and information from Ofsted.






What are you going to be reading this Easter?
