EXCELLENT ATTITUDE REWARD




Year 7 pupils receiving their awards this morning

PRINCIPIA MISSION—INTERNATIONAL SPACE STATION

On Tuesday 15th December at 11.03am, pupils watched the launch of the Principia Mission that took British Astronaut Tim Peake to the International Space Station (ISS). Pupils counting down to the launch could be heard from many classrooms, as they learnt about space flight. The mission is called Principia, after Isaac Newton's great work, the Principia Mathematica. Published in 1687, it spelled out Newton's law of gravity and his three laws of motion - widely held to be the greatest work of science ever published. Whilst on the ISS, Tim will complete experiments and educational activities designed to get young people interested in science. We will be following his mission closely and you can also get involved by signing up for Destination Space.
