St Bede's Curriculum Design Principles

<u>Within subjects</u>: The AQA A level breadth unit is taught chronologically in terms of monarchs but thematically within the reign of each monarch. At relevant points throughout the course comparisons with be made across the whole Tudor period in terms of religion, foreign, economic and social policy. Cultural developments will be discussed across the period 1485-1603.

Between subjects: This subject has links with some of the literature discussed in A level English literature and links to RF. The NEA taught unit on the Emergence of Civil Rights for African Americans interlinks with the GCSE history syllabus. The NEA is closely linked to the skills pupil develop in their EPQ.
